

Planning a Trip to Hatfield-McCoy Trails!

A Few Things to Know Before You Go!

When planning a trip to the Hatfield-McCoy Trails, it is important to make a few decisions before you arrive! You will need to figure out which trail system/s you would like to ride, pick a lodging facility that is near that trail and make sure that you get a trail permit before going out on your ride. Keep in mind that many of the lodging facilities and local businesses in our ATV-friendly towns sell the trail permits for your convenience. Permits are also available at all Hatfield-McCoy Trails trailhead facilities, HMT Welcome Center and Country Roads Visitor Center.

1.)Choose a Trail!

The Hatfield-McCoy Trails System is specifically designed to accommodate all levels of riders from novices to pros. Our team has worked hard to create an exciting and safe adventure for everyone. It is important to note that the trail system covers 1,000 miles of trails throughout southern West Virginia so remember, there is often some serious distance between the trails. For your convenience we have posted the descriptions, directions, trail connectors, and maps on our website to assist you in your planning process. Each system has its own personality. And while some systems are more scenic than others or extreme for others EACH SYSTEM has plenty of scenic views as well as rugged black trail terrain for those who desire more challenge in their riding experience. We currently have 10 different trail systems that are located throughout several counties in the southern portion of West Virginia! Some of our trail systems connect with each other, which are listed below.

Bearwallow Trail System does not connect with any other trail system.



Cabwaylingo Trail System does not connect with any other trail system.



Ivy Branch Trail System does not connect with any other trail system.



Rockhouse, Devil Anse and Buffalo Mountain Trail Systems all three connect.



Pinnacle Creek, Warrior, Indian Ridge and Pocahontas all four connect.

2.)Choose Your Lodging!

All lodging facilities that are listed on our website are privately owned and operated; therefore, you will need to contact them directly for reservations and concerns! There are many types of lodging choices available when you are planning your trip to the Hatfield-McCoy Trails. We recommend researching the list of lodging providers on our website to find the one that is right for you! One tip that we also offer is to consider which trail system you are riding as well as the type of lodging accommodations you prefer. The Hatfield-McCoy Trails, including each of our ten trail systems, span over seven counties throughout southern West Virginia. So, choosing the right location is key. Lodging choices available include but are not limited to hotels and motels, cabins, bed & breakfasts, primitive and full hook-up campgrounds, and homes of all types.

3.)Get a Permit!

Each person visiting the Hatfield-McCoy Trail System, including passengers, is required to purchase an individual User Permit. This Permit allows you to ride, in accordance with our rules, on a thousand miles of private land that make up our trails. User Permits must be always displayed on the user's helmet while on the trails.

West Virginia Resident Discount- Individuals that are residents of West Virginia, with proof of a WV driver's license or WV state issued ID, may purchase a WV Resident permit.

Military Option- Individuals that are currently serving or have previously served in the United States Military are eligible to purchase a WV Resident Permit, regardless of their residency. This Military option is for the cardholder only and can be redeemed at a Hatfield-McCoy Trails facility or participating permit vendor.

Misplaced, lost, stolen or unused permits are NOT refundable.

All permits are valid from the date of purchase until December 31st of that year.
